## Ahoy members and friends!

The 4<sup>th</sup> of July is our next big holiday when several of us will be enjoying ourselves and having fun on the water. ABC/RUSSPS; (America's Boating Club/Rochester United State Sail & Power Squadron) is an organization that promotes safe boating through educational programs and events. We recently completed Sailing classes and our second NYS Boating Certification. As a reminder you will be required to have this certification in 2025 to operate a boat and any jet ski.

### Some key things you should know:

- Children 10 and over will also be required to have this certification to operate any jet ski or water vessel and can take the boater certification classes.
- If you have previously taken this course and received a certification card; but have misplaced or lost it. First determine if you took the course with America's Boating Club Rochester United States Power Squadron, you should complete the form on the website at <u>America's Boating Club</u>-<u>Get A Replacement Boating Card</u> (americasboatingclub.org)
- If you obtained your boater certificate through NYS, contact them at <a href="https://ilostmycard.com/">https://ilostmycard.com/</a>.

I'd like to share some excerpts taken from an article that in its fullness can be found on the face book page of America's Boating Club of Rochester...

Recently Released U.S. Coast Guard Safety Stats Tell Boaters About How To Spend America's Birthday on the Water

With congested waterways and night operation, boaters need an increased focus on safety over the July Fourth holiday.

Lakes, launch ramps and harbors will again be crowded on the boating season's traditional peak holiday period surrounding the July Fourth holiday. As the number of boats, personal watercraft and paddle craft goes up, boaters should not look further than recently released annual U.S. Coast Guard statistics for some lessons on how to keep everyone aboard safe during this busy time of the year, especially for on-water fireworks shows.

- According to data from the recently released 2022 Recreational Boating Statistics, the top five primary contributing factors in boating accidents last year were:
- · operator inattention,
- operator inexperience,
- improper lookout,
- excessive speed,
- · machinery failure.

"Nearly all of these factors will come into play on the water around Independence Day, and especially on the evenings with fireworks shows when boaters congregate to view them,"

"After the show ends, as boating spectators pull anchor and head for home en masse, is really when a boat operator will experience the significant difference from operating during the daytime." Edmonton explains that it is much more difficult to distinguish boat speed, direction or angle, and distance to other moving vessels at night. "Double check to ensure your navigation lights are working properly to ensure others see you," he said. Compounding the problem is the race to get home. "Many simply travel too fast for the conditions," he said. "Everyone is leaving at the same time, and you will really need to focus on safety. Use others on your boat as extra lookouts, and keep your eyes focused ahead while scanning around you." You may feel you look around quite well, but you may want to use the following method of **SCAN**:

**Search** the area all around your craft. This is a 360-degree examination of everything on the water around your boat. Distances away will close or open depending on your speed or the speed of the observed boat or object. The faster you're operating, the farther out you'll need to search.

**Concentrate** on what you're seeing. Is it a boat? What type? What is it doing? What is its relative speed? Is it a stationary object? Drifting or anchored? Things can happen fast out there, so these are questions you must consider while you look at the various observed boats or objects.

Analyze what you're watching. Is it closing in on your position or going away from you? Remember, if the object you're observing is at a constant bearing with decreasing range (meaning you're getting closer to it, and its relative position to you is not changing), it is on a collision course. If it's another boater, do you believe he or she sees you? Never assume you're seen by other boat operators, who may or may not

be distracted. Determine this by the way and direction they're operating. Analyze how far away the boat or object is and how fast it is closing the distance between you and it.

**Negotiate.** What are you going to do? Slow down, turn away from the boat or object, and head in a different direction? Remember the Navigation Rules. Learn the proper action to take while meeting head on, crossing, or overtaking another boat.

Additionally, a long day on the water means stressors such sun, wind and wave action degrade a boat operator's ability, and adding alcohol to the mix only makes the situation worse. It's much better to celebrate America's birthday and imbibe when you are at the dock or safely ashore.

Because everyone wants to see the show, overloading is also a real issue this time of year. Small vessels are prone to swamping in the wake action that follows the close of a show. Weight and balance should be top of mind for small boat operators.

Paddle craft will also add to the on-water congestion this time of year. Paddlers may not have the full set of safety skills and may not be easy to see, or they might be paddling on highly trafficked waters, so keep an eye out for them.

Finally, before you head out at night, know how to dim the brightness on your chart plotter or GPS, check your running lights, and ensure your visual distress signals are available if you find yourself in need of assistance.

Have fun on the water and be vigilant and safe!


## Naming a Boat

#### **SEO Report**

Been a busy Spring here at the Education Department.

Instructor Don Reaves has wrapped up a very successful ABC course that he has taught at the Penfield Recreation Center.

- He had 9 students in the class (including 3 teenagers) and all except one has now passed.

Asst. SEO Instructor Rick Hibbs is wrapping up a SAIL class at the Irondequoit Library plus some on the water training on his Sailboat VAMP, we look forward to reporting more at the class conclusion.

Already scheduled is a Marine Electrical Systems course to be taught by Instructor Don Reaves starting in September, again at the Penfield Rec Center, look for sign up and registration information coming soon!!

#### STAR PARTY AT THE D/6 RENDEZVOUS 2023

## Have you ever been to a star party? Well, here is your chance!!

<u>WHAT:</u> A star party is a gathering of astronomically inclined folks to **view** and/or **photograph** objects not on the earth; typically, viewing / imaging of planets in our solar system, or deep-sky objects within our Milky Way Galaxy and beyond, and is usually accomplished with telescope(s). All D/6 Rendezvous attendees are invited.

<u>POSSIBLE OBJECTS:</u> Saturn (the planet with the rings), our moon, nebulae, galaxies (Andromeda), star clusters. It will not be possible to focus on the International Space Station (ISS) or on satellites as they travel much too fast for our amateur telescopes.

**EQUIPMENT:** Two telescopes are planned for the 2023 D/6 star party; one for **viewing** using just a high power eyepiece and your eye; this scope will be directed towards a planet or possibly the moon. The other scope will be for **imaging** and be directed at deep-sky objects (DSOs) and will utilize a camera to capture the images.

WHEN:

Saturday, 5 August 2023 9:00pm until .... (Backup date if primary is a no-go).

**SKY CONDITIONS:** The sky conditions are key to a successful star party; if the sky condition on the 4<sup>th</sup> is totally, or even heavily clouded over, the event will be shifted to the backup date of the 5<sup>th</sup>. Also, the sky needs to be dark to be able to see the stars, etc. By dark, it is meant to be after astronomical twilight. On August 4<sup>th</sup>, evening astronomical twilight is just after 10:00pm. So, it is suggested that you plan your arrival to the star party for approximately 9:00pm and let your eyes become dark-adapted as the darkness pours in. While waiting for astronomical twilight, I will discuss the equipment and answer questions. Stay as late as you desire; there is no planned closing time for the party. The sun rises just after 6:30am.

<u>TIPS:</u> Please be courteous – limit your use of white flashlights; red flashlights do not hamper dark-adapted eyes. Bring your own chairs; bring mosquito repellant. When leaving the party, do not shine your car lights at the telescopes.
